- 2. We will publish the Article under the Creative Commons licence selected by you above. Where the selected licence is a non-commercial licence, we will receive exclusive commercial rights to the Article and non-exclusive commercial rights to the abstract. We may additionally create derivative works under all Creative Commons licences including CC BY-NC-ND and any other CC non-derivative licence.
- 3. You warrant that the Article is your original work, has not previously been published, and is not currently under consideration by another journal. If it contains material which is someone else's copyright, you warrant that you have obtained the unrestricted permission of the copyright owner (please attach evidence of this) and that the material is clearly identified and acknowledged within the Article. You also warrant that the Article does not contain anything which is defamatory, illegal, or infringes anyone's copyright or other rights. You agree to indemnify us against any claims in respect of the above warranties and this indemnity shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
- 4. You assert your Moral Right to be identified as the Author(s). We will respect your rights as the Author(s). That is, we will make sure that your name(s) is/are always clearly associated with the Article, and we will not make any substantial change to your Article without consulting you. When the Article is accepted, we undertake to publish it as soon as we reasonably can. On publication, we will send you a free digital copy. We will take all reasonable steps to maximise the visibility of the Journal, and of your Article within it.
- 5. You declare that any person named as co-author of the Article is aware of that fact and has accepted being so named.
- 6. Copyright remains yours, and we will acknowledge this in the copyright line which appears on your Article. However, you authorise us to act on your behalf to defend your copyright if anyone should infringe it, and to retain half of any damages awarded, after deducting our costs.
- 7. We will keep the information you have provided for record purposes; you permit your name and address to be reproduced in the Journal and on indexing and abstracting and bibliographic services. Your details will not be used for any other purpose.
- 8. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to its subject matter. No amendment or modification of any provision of this Agreement shall be valid or binding unless made in writing and signed by all parties. The full terms (legal code) of the Creative Commons licences may be accessed at http://creativecommons.org/licenses and are incorporated herein by reference as applicable for the Creative Commons licence selected by you for your Article.
- 9. The Publisher has the right to refrain from publication of the Contribution if in his opinion the form or content of the Contribution does not conform to what had been agreed or might reasonably have been expected. In this event the licence is voided and the Contribution shall be returned to the Author by the Publisher.
- 10. Any and all disputes which might arise in consequence of this Agreement shall be adjudicated exclusively by the competent court in Amsterdam, The Netherlands. The laws and orders of The Netherlands are exclusively applicable to this Agreement and to the legal relationship between the parties resulting from it.
